The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is considering the Take 3 timber sale project in the Cascades Resource Area of the BLM, Salem District. The purpose of this project is to achieve specific objectives identified in the Salem BLM Resource Management Plan (RMP) for Matrix and Riparian Reserve Land Use Allocations (LUA) on approximately 370 acres of BLM-administered lands. Average stand age range is from 30 to 90 years old. The proposed treatments for the Matrix LUA are commercial thinning. Within Riparian Reserves the proposed treatments are variable density management. Other activities may include road construction and/or renovation of existing roads that access project areas, and the decommissioning or blocking of roads after project completion. The BLM will also conduct slash treatment following activities.

The Take 3 project is located in the Eagle Creek Watershed approximately 15 miles east of Estacada in Clackamas County. The proposed units are located within sections 11 and 13 of Township 3 South, Range 5 East, Willamette Meridian.

You have been identified as someone who might have specific knowledge or interest in this area. The purpose of this letter is to give you an opportunity to share any information or concerns you may have about the project.

The enclosed map shows the location of the project area. Detailed maps are available upon request. Also enclosed is a Project Comment Form.

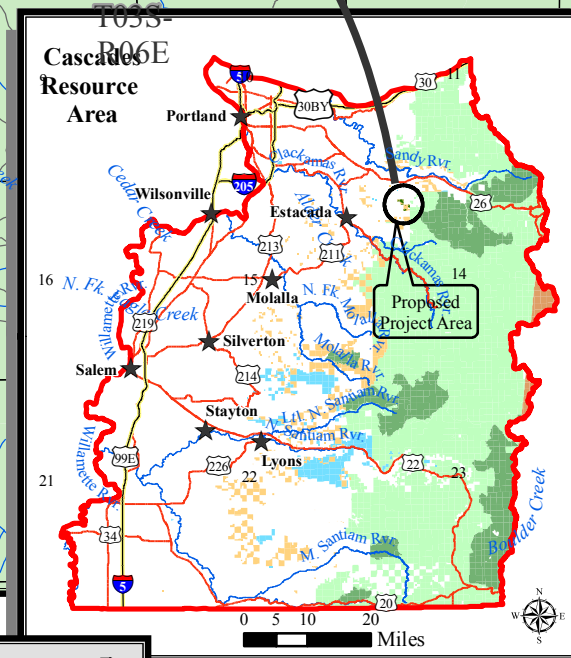
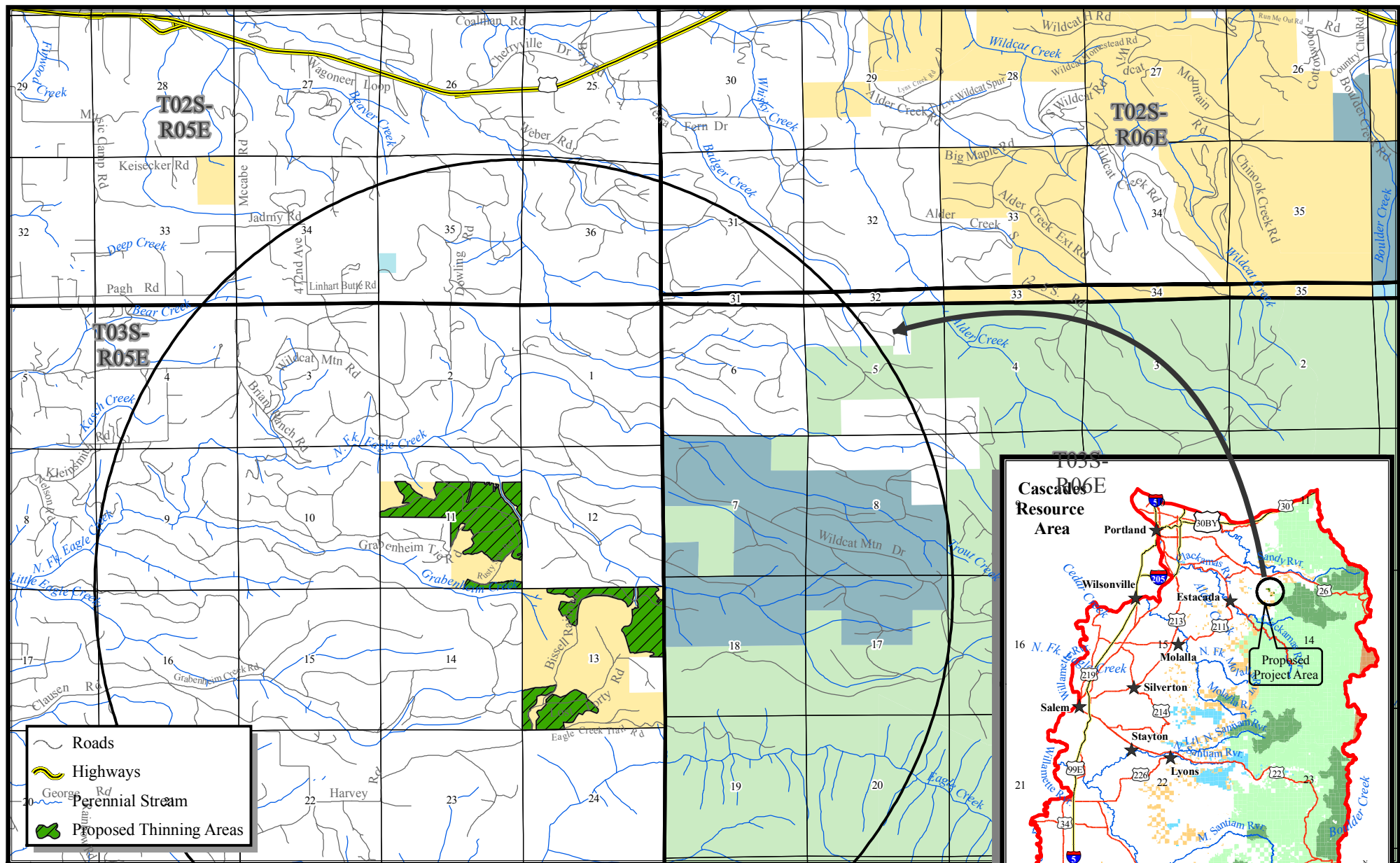
